The September 2017 Alumni Conference call was held on 12 September.

General Grizzle spoke on admissions, we are still without a director, but are close to hiring.

All of the cadets have still not arrived. We have 15 less cadets than last year, down 2.9%. ENMU-Roswell is down 9%. NMSU is down 13.8%, UNM is down 5.5% and State is down 9%. There were Office: 575-624-8250

about 40 students that didn't show because of financial issues. At this time we have 860 cadets, five years ago we had 905. We are still at a 95% occupancy rate. The Wall Street Journal this week ran a story about how American are losing faith in college education. Veterans and Veterans dependents qualify for in-state rate. Some private schools are now offering the same rate for domestic and international. We find this concept interesting. Because of the devaluation of the peso, there are some cadets from Mexico that we lost. The majority of cadets that we get from Mexico come from the wealthy upper-class. The number of Preps and ROTC cadets is out of our control. We are number one for the Merchant Marine Academy who accept only 7 cadets. NMMI received four and three went to Marion. General Grizzle explained that these are not excuses, only explanations. We are in good shape moneywise with 22 million in land grants. Cadets are performing great in leadership and academics. There are Preps paying their own way, hoping for an appointment. Athletics are struggling this

year so far. We hope to overcome the losses and show strength going forward. Broncos Volleyball is 3-1 with hopes for the National Conference. On November 5th in the Texas Stadium, the NMMI Color Guard will perform with Roger Staubach 1962 JC at the Dallas Cowboys Game. A full page add titled "On the Shoulder of Giants" featuring NMMI is on page 283 of the Dallas Cowboys Blue Book. Danny spoke on the final date of the 2017 Trail Ride. We will be going to Quemado, NM, for the 29th Annual NMMI Alumni Trail Ride with the Easterlings. We will have a different location than the previous camp at El Caso. We believe the new location will be great for our attendees. We will keep you posted. Save the date for 12-15 June 2018. The 30th Annual Trail Ride will be held at the Davis Ranch in Angel Fire in 2019. The location for the 2020 ride have not yet been determined.

We just returned from Chicago where we gathered with 21 attendees. Stan Jolton 1948 JC, our oldest alumnus in attendance was there with his girlfriend and told us that the last time he remembers an alumni gathering in his area was in the sixties. We asked each of the alumni to introduce and tell the group a little about themselves. What the school did for them and where their passion for the school comes from. It was a really good meet and greet. NMMI Alumnus, W. Rudd Marlowe 1967 HS-1969 JC, is planning to host a gathering for the NMMI Broncos vs. Tyler, TX, game on 21 October. IWatch for details coming up! General's Cup Annual Golf Tournament is filled! We currently have 77 teams, which is more than we planned. October 26-28. We already have over 170 alumni registered. A lot of the classes have stayed in touch since they left. It promises to be the best ever! The Alumni Luncheon and Hall of Fame Ceremony, the Alumni Love Feast and the Honored Class Dinners (with the exception of class of 1977) will be held at the Roswell Civic Center. See the schedule in this publication. The Alumni Love Feast this year will be a formal dinner and dance. The theme is "Masquerade Ball". It is not a costumed event, but we will have masks for each of you and there will be a photo booth with props. There is no cost for the photo booth. Alumnus Boyd West 1968 JC, from Oklahoma City would like to have a gathering. If you live in or around the Oklahoma City area, please call and let us know if you would be interested in attending a gathering there. We are still planning with Lee Jones 1968 JC in Houston to set a date for a gathering there. There is a longtime chapter in Houston that gather about every quarter now. After the first of the year, we will be traveling to New York, New Jersey, Washington, DC, and the Merchant Marine Academy. Our August NMMI Alumni Conference Call was held on 17 August. Our guest was MAJ Chance Mace, USAR, NMMI Director of Cadet Counseling and Chaplain.

General Grizzle started off with the numbers so far for cadets matriculated. NMMI was expecting 915, but so far we have 865 cadets. There are a number of cadets still not here, including ECP cadets. Again this year we have cadets from many countries, although the number from Mexico is down for a couple of reasons, the devaluation of the peso and the possibility of a wall being built between the US and Mexico. We have less Falcon Foundation cadets and 35 Coast Guard cadets, down from last year. NMMI Bronco Football had their 1st scrimmage and their

first game in will be 2 September in Miami, Oklahoma. On Sunday, 5 November, the NMMI Color Guard will be performing in Texas at the Dallas Cowboys game at halftime. This will have them on the schedule for the entire season.

The makeup of the corps is about 50/50 high school and junior college cadets.

Chaplain Mace talked about his background. He is currently in the Army Reserves. In addition to that he has worked as a missionary. He has been married for 25 years to Virginia and they have three daughters, ranging in age from 18-22. He preaches the Protestant service and coordinates with a Catholic Priest for the Catholic Services every Sunday. He also works with the Choir. He is verv excited about the Cadet Chaplain program. NMMI currently has four cadets pastoring with another three who are interested. It is hoped that one can be found in each troop. Services are provided for all religions at NMMI. Chaplain Mace works closely with local churches to get cadets to services for Jewish, Latter Day Saints, Seventh Day Adventists and others. The Navajo will be having a religious ceremony that centers around the Solar Eclipse on the 21st, believed to bring renewal to the members. Counseling for Cadets falls into many categories. While at NMMI, they encounter problems such as homesick, death and divorce. Sometimes they just need advice and someone to talk to. The NMMI Chapel is currently in the process of having the Stained Glass wall redone. It is expected to be completed in September. The Chapel is rented for many events, including weddings and memorials. He feels that it is one of the most beautiful chapels in Roswell. Darrell Hovland 1983 JC men-

tioned that there are about 20 alumni in northern Missouri who will gather for the solar eclipse. He also mentioned that he hopes to gather some alumni during homecoming to visit Captain Lea's grave at South Park Cemetery.

WHAT A CELEBRATION!

As the fiscal year comes to a close, we have reason to celebrate one of the most successful annual campaigns in recent memory. All of this could not be accomplished without the overwhelming support shown by our alumni, patrons, family and friends. As I hope many of you will remember, we started off the 2016-2017 school year celebrating the 125th anniversary of NMMI. In conjunction with this we wanted to focus our annual fundraising efforts on exceeding contributions in previous years, while also establishing a new endowment that will benefit cadets forever.

The goal was to try and obtain 1,000 donations in \$125 increments; although we fell short at 626 donations received, the monies generated have indeed surpassed what is needed to create this endowment. The "125" program was intended to use one-third of the monies generated to create the endowment and two-thirds would go towards the Annual Fund that benefits cadets through incentive scholarships and cadet activities. Approximate early numbers indicate that the "125" program will exceed \$78,000, of that roughly \$26,000 will be used to create the Squad Leader Endowment that will provide scholarships based on recommendation from the Commandant and staff.

The Squad Leader Endowment will provide scholarship funds to cadets who have such a great impact and influence on the Corps of Cadets; a position that sometimes is overlooked but never forgotten. The criteria to receive this scholarship will be set by the Commandant's Staff with the hopes of providing at least one \$1,000 scholarship to the best squad leader in the Corps (eligible cadets must meet the minimum criteria set by the Scholarship Committee).

As you can see we have met this goal and starting in 2018-2019 the Commandant will have this funding available. We can't begin to thank you all enough for your support of NMMI and the Corps of Cadets. We look forward to seeing you at an upcoming NMMI event.

Ways to Give

• **Bequest** — a provision in a will or estate plan that allocates all or part of the individual's estate to NMMI.

• **Charitable Remainder Trust** — an irrevocable trust that pays a specified annual amount to one or more people for a fixed period of years (often the life of the individual). At the end of the term of the trust, the remaining trust assets are distributed to NMMI. A charitable remainder annuity trust provides a fixed payment; a charitable remainder uni-trust pays out a fixed percentage of the trust value each year.

• **Charitable Lead Trust** — Similar to a charitable remainder trust, but the principal reverts to the donor or his or her designated heirs at the end of the trust term. If the principal reverts to the donor, he or she gets a charitable income tax deduction; if an heir, that person gets a charitable gift tax deduction.

• **Charitable Gift Annuity** — an irrevocable transfer of property (e.g. securities) in exchange for a contract to pay the donor an annuity for life. Because the value of the property exceeds the value of the annuity, it is partially a gift to the institution.

• **Life Insurance** — an arrangement in which a donor gives a life insurance policy to NMMI. The cash value of that gift is tax deductible, as are any future premiums the donor may opt to pay on that policy. Note that only life insurance policies that are paid in full qualify as planned gifts. (needs a not regarding proper way of doing this.)

• Life Estate — an arrangement in which a donor gives his/her home to NMMI while retaining the right to live there for the remainder of his/her life. The donor receives an immediate income tax deduction. NMMI may sell the property upon the donor's death.

• **Pooled Income Fund** — an arrangement, similar to a mutual fund, in which a donor contributes to a fund and receives a share of the proceeds based on the percentage of his contribution. Donors pay no capital gains on the transfer of appreciated property. When the donor dies, his shares transfer to NMMI.

• **Endowments** – A fund created by your bequest can carry your name or the name of a family member or other person you wish to honor. Named funds, because of the support they offer to programs and people, are a way to share what is meaningful to you within the institute family well into the future. *Note that minimum gift amounts required for creating named, endowed funds vary, so please contact the NMMI Foundation for further information.*

• **Unrestricted Gifts** - are among the most valuable to NMMI, because they allow the institute to allocate funds wherever the need is greatest, and to take advantage of unique opportunities as they arise. Your unrestricted contribution may be used to support costs associated with financial aid, educator development, cadet equipment, facilities, and much more.

• **Matching Gifts** - An easy way to double or even triple your donation to NMMI is to find out if your company has a matching-gift program. Such programs typically match all or a percentage of employee contributions to charitable organizations, making the employer a partner in employees' personal philanthropy. Simply obtain a matching-gift form from your employer's personnel office, fill it out, and provide it to NMMI with your contribution.
