Steven G. Zabel 1968 JC was inducted into the Oklahoma Sports Hall of Fame on 3 August 2015. Steve was inducted into the NMMI Alumni Hall of Fame in 1994. While at NMMI, he lettered in basketball; track, setting a school record in the high hurdles; and football, claiming All-American honors. Steve was recruited by the University of Oklahoma as a tight end in 1969 helping the Sooners to two Big Eight championships. He was selected in the 1970 NFL first round draft by the Philadelphia Eagles and was named the Philadelphia Eagle Co-MVP in 1971. In 1975, he was acquired by the New England Patriots, Steve retired a Baltimore Colt in 1979, ending his ten-year career in the NFL. Steve currently lives in Edmond, Oklahoma. 



