





# Cahoon Armory



### **New Bleachers Installed in Cahoon Armory**

Been to an athletic event in the Cahoon Armory gym, lately? If you haven't, here's two very good reasons why you should, and soon.

First, the Bronco basketball team is smack-dab in the middle of a WJCAC conference battle, trying to become the first NMMI team since 2001 to make the Regional Tournament. NMMI Commandant BG Richard V. Geraci, USA (Ret) 1975 JC has said this is "... clearly one of the best teams NMMI has had in ten years." The top four teams in the WJCAC move on to the post-season and the Region V Tournament.

Second, you can now watch the game in comfort, from your own stadium-backed chair, in our brand new bleachers. These new bleachers are telescopic, meaning they are able to be fully extended or collapsed, all at the touch of a button. This was phase one of a project designed to increase the practice space for NMMI's eight basketball and volleyball teams. When complete, after the basketball goals and posts for the volleyball net are installed and new lines are painted, the current single north-south court can be transformed into three full east-west courts, after retracting the bleachers.

A local company, AK Sales and Consulting, Inc., began the project during the holiday break, beginning with the removal of the old stationary bleachers. They've completed several similar projects, including the stadium seating in Artesia's Bulldog Bowl, and telescopic bleachers at Tatum High School.

"The addition of these new bleachers to the Cahoon Armory gym does three very important things," says NMMI Athletic Director Jose Barron. "It gives the gym a more modern look and aesthetic appeal. It increases the comfort level and adds to the experience for our fans. And it also allows greater use and greater flexibility in the use of the facility for our campus events."



# Chapter Events


Hello everyone!


life. As COL Goss stated, "Obedience is but self-command, and who commands himself is best learning to command others."




