Story from **COL Robert A. Culp, II 1986 JC**

Greetings from Forward Operating Base Ghazni in Afghanistan! I have been deployed with 1st Brigade, 10th Mountain Division on a nine-month tour since mid-January. Our mission is to advise and assist the Afghan National Security Forces in developing their capacity to assume full responsibility for their own security. Currently, I am commanding the Brigade's Special Troops Battalion and our mission is to provide critical Engineer, Signal, Intelligence and security support to the Brigade in order to enable our combat advisory mission. Additionally, I am the Deputy Commander of the Brigade and so, not only have I been given the honor and privilege of leading Soldiers in combat, but I have gained a unique opportunity to see the full scope of what the Brigade's operations over the past six months have achieved. Below are a few thoughts about what we are doing here in Afghanistan.

First, our Soldiers are incredible. I am continually amazed at how they are able to accomplish any assigned mission in one of the most difficult operating environments on the planet. Afghanistan, even without the threat of insurgent attack, is a tremendously challenging place to live and conduct operations. The weather and terrain, combined with the lack of infrastructure, makes this a very difficult place to maintain equipment and sustain our forces logistically. When you combine this with the asymmetric tactics that the insurgents employ against us, it makes this a difficult and dangerous place to operate. Yet, our Soldiers routinely accomplish all assigned missions and they do so with a great attitude and a tremendous amount of pride in what they are doing because they know that they are making a positive difference in the Afghan National Security Forces ability to assume responsibility for their own security.

As difficult and dangerous as it is for us to operate here in Afghanistan, it is even more so for our Afghan partners. They are not as well equipped or as well trained as we are, yet they continue to take the fight to the enemy. They do not have a choice. The enemy is resilient and is attempting to negotiate the end of the conflict here from a position of strength. The Taliban Senior Leadership has directed the focus of Taliban operations to shift to the Afghan National Security Forces and this has resulted in the Afghan National Security Forces now taking far more casualties than our forces. Far more... and they don't get to go home at the end of a nine-month tour.

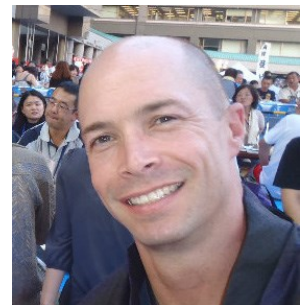
The Afghans know that they need to own the outcome of this fight and they are fighting to win. They have the more equipment and better training than the insurgents do. They are much better supplied than the insurgents. Most importantly, the Afghan National Security Forces have the support of the local people. Al Qaida can no longer operate freely in Afghanistan and their presence here is virtually irrelevant. The Taliban is no longer willing to host Al Qaida and probably never will again. Al Qaida has brought nothing but death and despair to the Afghan people and they are no longer welcome in Afghanistan. Conversely, the Afghan Army is now the most trusted institution in the country. Compare this to the fact that only about ten percent of the population supports the Taliban. The Afghans can win this and we have given them the capability to do it. I am incredibly proud of our Soldiers and what they have been able to accomplish here. Leading them has been the greatest privilege of my career. 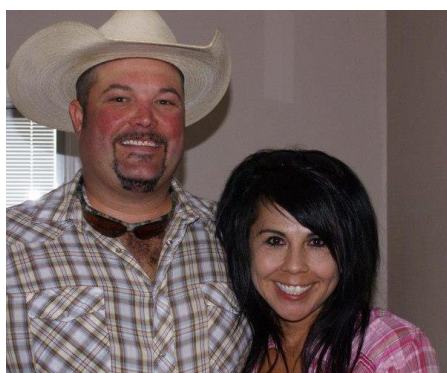

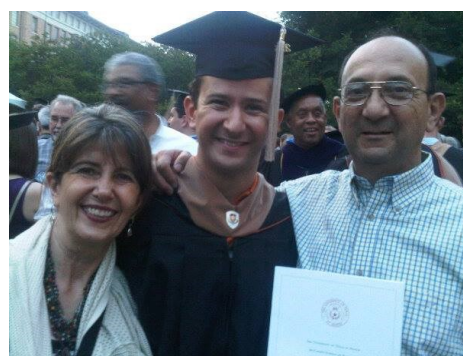

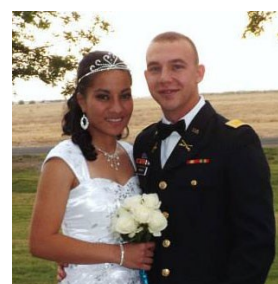

I had never even heard of NMMI when I received a brochure in the mail about the school during my senior year in high school. My dad saw it first, and since he had also attended military schools as a youth, and I was planning on a career, we decided to apply and he called the admissions office and spoke with Bob Shea, the registrar at that time. I was accepted right away and was excited to know I was getting to attend a military college like I had wanted. After ROTC Basic at Fort Knox that summer, I headed to Roswell with my fellow Hawaiians. When we got there, Junso Ogawa met us at the airport with the big bus and carted us over to the campus. We were there a few days earlier than the rest of the incoming RATs because it had been too costly and time consuming to send us home to Hawaii and then fly us back to Roswell.

My first impression of the campus was that it was very majestic and I enjoy architecture, so the buildings were an instant hit. For my first day there, I was able to walk around and check out where things were located. That evening, I found myself at Sally Port watching the Corps form up for SRC. I felt right at home, and was looking forward to doing that soon. As I was

standing watching the Corps march through on their way to Bates Hall, a cadet, **Glede W. S. Holman 1981 JC**, came up to me and introduced himself and asked me if I wanted to join the corps for supper. Knowing how things are at the service academies between plebes and old cadets, I was not expecting this and for this I have always remembered Glede as my first friend on The Hill.

Fast forward to RAT time, my first semester (I was JC, so shorter sentence!). When I look back at that semester, I have to admit that was some of the most fun I have ever had in school. I am sure if one digs deep enough, there might be some pathology behind my thinking RAT time is FUN! Nevertheless, I did think it was fun and I really enjoyed becoming knowledgeable and to this day I can still report the condition of the cow, or tell you why fire engines are red. All my life, from my parents' reports, I liked doing things that were very challenging to see how I could make a game of it, so once I did that as a RAT, the time sailed by and next thing I knew, I was a Yearling.

I was involved in some great activities, like the HQ Band, Elite Guard (yes, a girl. I was the first female on the team), and Saunders Cavalry. Some funny stories around these too....one morning in BRC formation, **Laurie A. Pallesen 1981 JC** came running over asking for volunteers to join the band. She had some instruments that needed players. One of the instruments she held up was the Glockenspiel, or bells. I thought, "Well, that looks fairly easy to play", so I raised my hand and I was suddenly a musician in the marching band! I had no idea how to play that thing, so I made sure to learn at least the NMMI Fight Song so I could at least sound legit.

Not too long after that, I decided I wanted to join the drill team. Well, the team, Elite Guard, was traditionally all male, so I decided that was an even better reason to try out. **Larry D. Meadows 1981 JC** came over to my area on the Slab, and had me bring my rifle out

to the grassy area by the building. I could tell he was trying to think of a skill so difficult that I would never be able to do it and that would solve the issue of females on the team. So he said, "OK, throw a triple" and demonstrated it for me. Well, like I was saying earlier, I like a challenge and a game, and guess what happened..... So here I am on the drill team and in the band at the same time; no problem, right? Wrong! At the homecoming game that year at the Wool Bowl, HQ **AND** Elite Guard were scheduled to perform! Somehow I would have to play with the band in my band uniform, then get into my drill team uniform and perform. I couldn't back out because I was part of the performing block. Along comes **Anne E. Reeder 1981 JC** to save the day! She went to her room and came out with one of her uniforms and tells me to get into my drill team uniform then put her uniform over it, so I would have two sets of clothing on. Off to the game we go. I went out onto the field and did my thing with the band, and then as soon as the last note was played, I went running off to the end zone where my fellow drill teamers were standing with my rifle and beret waiting for me. As I was blazing across the field, I was tearing off clothes and by the time I got to the end zone I was in my other uniform. I turned right around and went out and performed with the team. That was the topic of conversation and laughter for many days after.

At the end of my first year, I was given the position of Regimental QM Officer, and was in charge of Bates Hall, which meant managing the troops doing "waiters" duty. It was during my time that the epic food fight occurred, still the stuff of legend to this day!


