I enjoy life with my wife, son, and two daughters.





In the November issue of New Mexico Stockman, we'll be honoring one of New Mexico's modern-day legends.

Cattleman of the Year, Stirling Spencer has been known throughout his life as an activist for all things agriculture. He's is an industry favorite. His upbeat attitude and his curiosity, enthusiasm for life and his keen insight and intelligence, have gained him a host of friends and admirers in every segment of New Mexico society.

Stirling was 1968 NMMI Regimental Commander. His great-grandfather, William C. McDonald was New Mexico's

first Statehood Governor 1937. His father, **Truman A. Spencer, Jr. 1933 HS**—**1935 JC** and his brother, **LTC Steven M. Spencer, USA (Ret) 1963 HS**—**1965 JC** were both awarded the George Ward Memorial in 1976 and 1986 respectively. Spencer has been owner and operator of the family ranch, the Bar W, in Carrizozo since 1976 and was named the Soil and Water Conservation Rancher of 1994. He has served Lincoln County, New Mexico as Chairman of the Carizozo Public School Board, Lincoln County Historic Commission, Probate Judge and Director of the New Mexico Cattle Growers Association. He has attended numerous NMMI Alumni Trail Rides and hosted the Trail Ride at his ranch in 2003.



## Health Announcement

### **ANNOUNCEMENT ON EBOLA**

22 October 2014

As a boarding school that attracts students from all over the world and sends students on a variety of state, national, and international programs, NMMI carefully tracks international current events to make sure we are prepared to support our cadets. We are monitoring the Ebola epidemic in West Africa and in the areas of the U.S. where it has appeared, and our Health Services team, in coordination with local and state health officials, is taking all necessary precautions to ensure the safety and wellbeing of our cadets, faculty and staff.

Although the risk of contracting Ebola is extremely low, our medical staff is trained and ready to respond quickly to any infectious disease outbreak. Knowing that NMMI cadets and families travel all over the world, our health services team is carefully monitoring the campus community. We are following recommendations from the national Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), as well as those from state and local departments of health and professional health organizations for independent schools, colleges, and universities.

What follows are some frequently asked questions and answers about Ebola:

#### What is Ebola?

Ebola is a severe, often fatal, disease, discovered in 1976 near the Ebola River in the Democratic Republic of Congo. There have been a number of outbreaks since its identification. The current outbreak has been ongoing in Guinea, Liberia, and Sierra Leone for several months.

#### How is Ebola transmitted?

It is transmitted to people from wild animals and spreads from human to human through direct contact, as when broken skin or mucous membranes come into contact with blood, bodily secretions, or needles contaminated with infected bodily fluids. Ebola is NOT airborne, food-borne, or waterborne. A person is infectious to others only when they have symptoms of illness.

#### What are the symptoms of Ebola?

Symptoms begin abruptly with fever, malaise, and headache, with diarrhea about five days later. Symptoms usually occur 8–10 days after direct contact with bodily substances of an infected person. The incubation period may be up to 21 days, but does not extend beyond this.

Ok, enough of the shameless, self-promotion—let's get to the highlights:


### Colt Soccer

- With one game remaining in the regular season, junior striker Everardo Ahumada has broken the single-single record for goals with 25. The previous record was 22, set by Jorge Garza in 2012.
- Head Coach John Barbour and his Colts have already wrapped up the District 4(1A-4A) title with a perfect 5-0 district record; one match at Ruidoso remaining. The Colts are 12-3-1 overall this season and will likely get a top-four seed in this year's State Championship bracket.



### Colt Football

- Head Coach Randy Montoya and his Colts started the season with a 6-0 record, but have yet to win a district game. They're currently 6-2 on the season and 0-2 in District 4-4A; a 37-0 loss at Ruidoso, and a 27-7 loss at home to St. Michael's.
- Two games remain in the regular season, both district contests: one at Albuquerque's Milne Stadium on Nov. 1 vs. Hope Christian at 1:00 pm; one at home vs. Portales on Nov. 7 at 7:00 pm.



The Colts are currently ranked seventh in the State for 4A football, but they need to pull out at least one more win to ensure an at -large bid to the 12-team NMAA Class 4A State Championships.

### Colt & Lady Colt Cross Country

After moving up two classifications this year due to enrollment increases and the



NMAA going to a 6A system, the Colt boys' cross country team might find it hard to repeat as district champs. Head Coach Jan Olesinski has been prepping his team, however, by entering several big-school meets, running against 5A and 6A competition. His top runners have fared well.

Junior Juan Estremadoyro has three top-ten finishes including second place in the Roswell City Meet. Senior Spencer Lane has two top-ten finishes including fourth at the Roswell City Meet. For the girls, senior Amira Hindi won the Roswell City meet and has never finished below eighth place this season.

### Bronco Football

- After back-to-back winning seasons and a big win at last year's El Toro Bowl, this season Head Coach Joe Forchtner and his Broncos finished 7th in the regular season Western State Football Conference standings with a 2-6 mark.
- The Broncs still have two more games, thanks to the WSFL playoff system, in it's second year of implementation. NMMI will travel to Mesa, AZ to again take on the Gauchos on Nov. 1 in their first game in the WSFL Consolation bracket. Game time is still yet to be determined. For a

### **Bronco Volleyball**

 Head Coach Shelby Forchtner and her Bronco volleyball team have a 14-18 overall record this season. But don't let that sub .500 mark fool you—this is a very good and talent team. They've put up wins against some of the top-



ranked teams in the NJCAA. The Lady Broncos have four more matches left in the regular season, and a sweep would mean a winning -season record, a second place finish in the Western Junior College Athletic



Conference, and a bye in the first round of the Region V West Postseason Tournament.
