# Sabers Return to the Corps

# Phillip Mark Williams 1967 JC

In the fall of 1963, Phillip
Mark Williams 1967 JC began
life as a new cadet. Mark was
honored and grateful to have
spent all four years in
Headquarters Company...
("Pixies") as a snare drummer in
the marching band and drum and
bugle corps.

His 2nd class year, he was the Commander of the Drum & Bugle corps. During his 2nd and 1st class years, Mark was a

member of the "D'Fenders" Rock and Roll Band with **Dan Burnett 1967HS**, **Peter Brecker 1965HS** - **1967JC**, **Ed Kidwell 1964HS** - **1966JC**, **Charlie Rouzer 1986HS**, **Fred Alvarez 1968HS** and **Skip Coleman 1967JC** - all NMMI cadets.

In May 1967, "Maud" graduated as 1st Cadet LT/ Headquarters Company Executive Officer. From NMMI, he attended Texas Tech, graduating with his BBA/Marketing. He is the proud and grateful son of Nan and **Walter Williams 1934 HS 1936 JC**. Brother of Rick Williams, USNA 1966 (all deceased).

Mark's career includes 6 years USAF Reserves, 5 years Las Vegas Limo chauffer, 40 years as an Oregon Real Estate Broker/Licensee and various other enjoyable pursuits. He has two terrific sons, Lorin in Hawaii and Rik in Pasadena, CA, and lovely wife, Sarah Jane.

Mark recently returned to NMMI to present not one, but two sabers to NMMI and Corps of Cadets.

Saber #1 was worn by his father **Walter Jackson W. J. Williams 1934 HS 1936 JC**. The 1936 saber has been in
Mark's family possession for 77 years and now will soon be
worn by a cadet officer of the Corps of Cadets. Mark's father is
believed to have spent most of his NMMI experience in Kllo
Troop. Following graduation from NMMI Mark's father was
commissioned into the U.S. Army but received quick
honorable discharge due to a medical condition.

In 1942 Walter Williams married Nancy Ann Long and moved to Los Angeles, CA. Mark's mother worked at Douglas Aircraft while his father worked at Lockheed Aviation. He went into farming cotton and alfalfa for 10 years in Pecos, TX, and 13 years at the Pahrump Ranch which is on the outskirts of Las Vegas, NV. Walter Jackson "W. J." Williams passed away in 1993.



## Clark W. Coleman, Jr. 1967 JC

After graduation from NMMI, Clark W. Coleman, Jr. 1967 JC returned to Las Vegas and received his four year degree from UNLV in Business and Law Enforcement. He went to work with the Las Vegas Police Department in October 1969 and worked for 27 years.

After retirement and some time off for travel, he became a Las Vegas Deputy Constable serving court papers and doing evictions.

Following the death of his son in a vehicle accident, he retired again and now spends his time riding around the country with a law enforcement motorcycle club and going to his cabin in Duck Creek, Utah. He met his wife Karen early in his career when she was serving as a police dispatcher.

A highlight of his time at NMMI was as a two year member of the Centurion Guard rifle drill team. Coleman's years at NMMI set the stage for the rest of his life, "I received the study habits, discipline, teamwork and maturity needed for a successful career in Law Enforcement. When asked to create the first organized Las Vegas Police Honor Guard, it was because my superiors knew of my NMMI training," Coleman said.

His father Clark Coleman joined the US 3rd Cavalry in the 1930's. By 1940 the horse cavalry was being phased out and would become the US 3rd Armored Cavalry in 1943. He chose the Army Air Corps. When the war broke out he was assigned to the Eight Air Force in England. He was the Base Intelligence Officer assigned to what was called The War Room Theater. He was promoted a full Colonel in 1948 and sent to the Las Vegas Gunnery base in Las Vegas, NV. He was assigned as the interim base commander with orders to oversee the transition of this facility into a full-fledged Air Force base. They wanted a flyer to name the base after so he picked a committee of officers to approve a new base name. He discovered that a pilot Lt Gary Nellis who had been from Las Vegas, was shot down and killed in 1944. Lt Nellis was a P47 fighter bomber pilot who was strafing a German convoy when he was hit by antiaircraft fire and crashed. So it became Nellis Air Force Base. His saber from the US Cavalry (1936) was given to Coleman when he went to NMMI and become a cadet officer his First Class year. It has been on his wall for 46 years and now it becomes the property of NMMI to be assigned to new promoted cadet officers.

**Chris Cole 1979 HS** ~ I formally studied native peoples at the University of Arizona, and later transferred to the University of New Mexico, where I studied political science. I have an interest in people and travel, and that all came together when, in the 1980s, I worked as a guide for a group of German tour operators in Alaska. Later, in 1993, I co-founded Aventuras Centro Americanas in San Pedro Sula, Honduras; I co-founded the Honduran Tour Operators Association. In addition to being an avid adventurer, I enjoy nature and 4x4 expeditions. I was a consultant to Land Rover in 1993, assisting the Land Rover team in mapping the route for the Honduran portion of the Ruta Maya in 1994, and the Camel Trophy run in 1995. I also co-founded a chain of automotive

dealerships importing Russian UAZ vehicles into Honduras, Guatemala, and Belize. These rugged off-road 4x4 vehicles were used in our Maya Tours in the early 1990s. My world got turn upside down by the wrath of Hurricane Mitch in October 1998. I restarted life all over again. I enjoy time with my children, Marco and Andrea and together we spend lots of time exploring. I am active in Florida equine sports, attending my daughter's shows. My son loves to shoot and is a great marksman for being 11 and hopefully a future cadet. I currently reside in Sarasota, Florida, with my family, though I still maintain friendships in my native Abiquiu, NM. I also keep a home in Trujillo, Honduras, where I am actively involved in historical preservation and sustainable real estate development. I am currently in the process of launching a National Tour Company here in the U.S.

**J.C. Dodd 1978 HS** ~I started as a 6th Classman and graduated in three years as a First Sergeant. My home during my NMMI years was Andrews, TX. I spent all three years in the Box in B Troop and as a member of the Goss Rifle Drill Team. My 3rd Class year was the first year female cadets attended and I have a great deal of respect for those brave few that changed history. I did not return to the Hill until my 30th reunion in 2008. I went to my first Trail Ride in 2010. Since then, I have not missed a Homecoming or a Trail Ride. I was inducted into the HOF in 2010, which was the greatest honor of my career. I regret my thirty year absence from the Hill, but I cherish every trip back and my friendships with my fellow alumni. I have no better friends than my NMMI Alumni friends, some as close as brothers.



After graduating from NMMI, I enlisted in the Marine Corps Reserves and spent three years as a Marine prior to transferring to the Texas Army National Guard. I went to Fort Rucker, AL, in May 1983 and became a Warrant Officer and helicopter pilot. I served on active duty as a Huey pilot for almost eight years, first in Panama then at Fort Carson, CO. I became a California Highway Patrol Officer in 1991. I worked the road in Marin County for three years, then I continued my career as a CHP law enforcement, search and rescue and medevac pilot based out of Auburn, CA, until I retired in 2010. I continued my military career in the California Army National Guard as a search and rescue and medevac pilot, first flying Hueys, then Blackhawks. I retired as a Chief Warrant Officer Four and Master Army Aviator in 2000. I am currently a Reserve Deputy for the Placer County Sheriff's Department.

I met my soulmate Jacqueline in August of 1991 and we married in July 1993. We have lived in Applegate since 1994. We have two children, Sasha and Max (both ten) but they will not attend NMMI as they are yellow labs.

# <u>Colbert Baker Edwards</u> <u>1943 JC</u> <u>1922 ~ 2003</u>

A few months ago the Alumni Relations Office received a call from a lady who told us she had a box in her garage that was given to her now deceased husband. She said the box contained information on a cadet who attended NMMI from 1940-1943. She said she did not want to throw the items away since it contained military decorations and someone's story. Since Mr. Edwards had no other living family members we asked her to send the box to NMMI.

When we received the "old cardboard box" we were surprised to find the NMMI alumnus' entire life in the box from the time he left "The Old Post" in June of 1943.

Shortly after leaving NMMI, Mr. Edwards was called to active duty on 18 February 1943.

Upon completion of training at Lowry Field, Denver, CO, he was assigned as a B-24 door gunner in the South Pacific; 400th Bomb Squadron; 90th Bomber Group.


From a newspaper article written 1945 "Staff Sergeant Colbert B. Edwards, 22 will return to the United States soon after serving with the famed Jolly Rogers. Sgt. Edwards, a gunner aboard a Liberator, flew 50 combat missions for a total of 402 hours in action. He has been decorated with an Air Medal, three Oak Leaf Clusters and the Distinguished Flying Cross for his part in a 3,000 mile reconnaissance mission over Borneo from a base in the Dutch East Indies. Edwards, a graduate of New Mexico Military Institute, has been in the Army two years".

Mr. Edwards was discharged from active duty 22 August 1954. He passed away 7 July 2003.

# "Jolly Rogers" – 90th Bomb Group – WWII

Their story began back in April 1942, when the group was activated – a true "war baby". They were the first unit to take the almost untried B-24 into action in the Southwest Pacific. From November 1942 until the Japanese surrendered 34 months later, they relentlessly carried the war to the enemy, from eastern New Guinea and Rabul to Borneo. The Phillipines, Formosa and finally to the Coast of China.

General Story's military education included the Command and General Staff College, Armed Forces Staff College, and a Senior Service College Fellowship at the University of Texas, Austin.

Regiment; Deputy Crew Commander and Chief Space Negation
Section, Space Defense Operations Center, J-3, U.S. Space Command;
S-3 and Executive Officer, 2nd Squadron, 17th Cavalry, 101st Airborne
Division (AASLT); Professor of Military Science, University of Colorado
- Colorado Springs; Commander, 4th Squadron, 2nd Armored Cavalry
Regiment; G-3 Aviation Officer, III Corps; Chief of Staff, U.S. Army
Space Command; Chief of Operations, U.S. Army Space and

My interest in the Institute first came about when I saw an Institute information card that had been placed in the counseling office at South High School in Torrance, CA. After completing all of the paperwork, I found myself a RAT in I Troop in August, 1974. I stayed in I Troop for the two years while I was at the Institute. My concentration was criminal justice. I attained the President's List during my last year at the Institute. I was also a squad leader, Drill Team supply, and participated in the Early Commissioning Program.

I transferred to the University of North Dakota and earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in Political Science with a minor in Economics in 1978. I was also commissioned a Second Lieutenant in the Army's Quartermaster Corps and completed an MBA from the California State University in Long Beach in December 1981. From 1978 until 1982, I was a Platoon Leader in a Repair Parts Company at Fort MacArthur in San Pedro, California. In the interim, I completed the resident Quartermaster Officer Basic and Advanced Courses as well as the Fuels and Energy Management Course at Ft Lee. From December 1982 until September 1985, I was the Battalion Adjacent for the 100th Supply and Service Battalion, at Ft Sill.

In September 1985, I was released from active duty and joined the Government Accountability Office (GAO) as an Analyst. GAO is Congress' watchdog, and I have been on many studies for Members of Congress since then. I have studied border security, military repair parts inventory, and income tax rates for various Congressional committees. I have been studying aviation issues for the House Aviation Subcommittee for the past 10 years.

In January 1988, while riding a pedal bike, I went over the handle bars of the bike and bruised my spine in my neck. This caused a scab to form on my spine which interferes with my ability to control my muscles. However, I am up and walking, so thank God for that.

I have been recruiting for the Institute for about the past 15 years, mainly at local college fairs and I recruit for the high school and Junior Leadership Camp as well. I have also been involved with the Institute and Corps of Cadets for about the past five years with Kilo Troop and the alumni effort to bring aviation training to the Institute. Thanks to the Institute's corporate leadership, as well as its faculty and staff, aviation training is becoming a reality at the Institute. I have sponsored trips for the Institute's aviation, engineering, and math cadets to Trinity Site, the Very Large Array (VLA), Spaceport America, and the Unmanned Aircraft Lab at New Mexico State University. This March, we plan on going to Eclipse Aerospace in Albuquerque.


A tradition was established, a great crowd of parents and Alumni were there, and we sent the Broncos home 2-1.




