The May conference call featured LTC Sonya Rodriguez, NMMI, Director of Financial Aid.

The call began with General Grizzle speaking on graduates. Our guest speakers for the Junior College will be Lieutenant Governor of New Mexico, John Sanchez and Dr. Barbara Dameron, the cabinet secretary for Higher Education.

He talked about the cadet "numbers" which is at 693 now, compared to 688 last year at this time. He stated that over 90% of the Corps of Cadets is in good standing. It has been a great year at NMMI for athletics. You can visit their <u>page</u> to see what has been happening!

General Grizzle thanked everyone for supporting NMMI, we are now at \$265,000 giving in the annual fund. All of your contributions to the Annual Fund, General's Cup and Trail Ride Auction goes directly to the Corps of Cadets. The 125th Anniversary giving has been very successful at over \$60,000. One-third of the 125th contributions will go to a squad leader Scholarship. The number of donors is at 692 so far this year compared to 569 for last year. We thank all of you for the generosity you have shown to your alma mater.

Danny spoke about upcoming events, the 1st Annual NMMI

Alumni Motorcycle Rally with close to 40 participants.

The Trail Ride is almost here with only a few weeks to go! We believe it will be the best ride ever! This year we will have the Trail Ride Golf Tournament at the Inn of the Mountain Gods Championship Golf Course. The Horseshoe tournament has become very popular and also back by popular demand is the NMMI Blanket race at the Ruidoso Downs Race Track in the Turf room at no charge. New this year is the Pony Hop races. We expect it to be a very fun activity! Upcoming chapter events are the Burgers Orell in Albuquerque in the 19th of May, 6-9 July in New Orleans and September 9th in Chicago. We are also working on Wisconsin, Maine and Las Vegas.

Danny introduced Colonel Sonya Rodriguez from the Financial Aid Department at NMMI. Sonya has been with NMMI for 33 years and with her staff of five, they have a combined total of 80 years of experience.

Sonya explained the automated process from Admissions that helps them find recipients based on merit, need and demographics.

They award about one millions dollars every school year, from

Alumni, Foundation and Trust. Some of the scholarships are broad based and some are very restrictive. The more restrictive, the more difficult it is to award.

The information in the automated database is updated constantly and when there are any scholarship dollars leftover, they will send out a note to the Corps of Cadets, letting them know the criteria they need to award those funds.

The minimum qualification is 2.0 term GPA and a "C" in deportment. There is a scholarship cap of \$1,000 of the total cost of attendance. The New Mexico Leaislature Scholarship requires a 2.0 cumulative GPA over 4 years. To receive the Legislative Scholarship requires the cadet write a 200 plus word essay. The legislators in the past have accepted 112 letters per school year, but just added 50, so now we have 162 letters. They can also request a \$500 hardship addition.

The cadets are required to write thank you letters to the donors. Sonya's group also thanks donors and Fund Managers.

In the Q&A a question was asked about the closure of Wentworth Military Academy and what that means to NMMI. Our Admissions department attended a College Fair with the approximately 220 displaced students. Wentworth has a large number of international students. NMMI offered a \$2,000 scholarship to encourage them to join us at NMMI.

Please read the Criteria for each category and if the alumnus you have in mind qualifies for all the criteria in a category, you can nominated them by sending the <u>nomination</u> <u>form</u>, signed by you and at least one other alumnus. The final call for nominations is **14 July 2017**.

Eminence in a Chosen Field of Endeavor

Alumni who have gained prominence, fame, or have distinguished themselves by notable accomplishments in their profession or other field of endeavor.

Achievements must transcend mere success in business. Ordinarily, prominence must be recognized on a national scale. Official recognition by a national organization of professional peers, having established standards and ethical requirements, is a strong consideration. A high recognition by a department or agency of the federal government is a strong consideration. This includes, but is not limited to, the Presidential Medal of Freedom, the Distinguished Intelligence Cross, or the Distinguished Intelligence Medal of the CIA, or their equivalent in other agencies.

Service to NMMI

Dedicated and outstanding service and devotion to NMMI transcends a satisfactory performance of normal duties. A nominee's devotion and dedication must be significant not only by his or her high standards but also by their own personal example. He or she must have adhered closely to the officially recognized customs and traditions of NMMI. He or she must have shown a willingness to devote their own time or resources to further the aims and goals of NMMI.

Positions of high responsibility include not only positions of policy formulation and decision-making, but also includes positions in direct contact with cadets influencing their academic achievement, enhancing their military training, strengthening them physically, or developing their moral character. Service to NMMI over a number of years should be considered to be for at least a quarter of a century. A lesser time might be a consideration of the overall impact of their service was of great significance. To be avoided is the popular individual whose pleasing personality did little more than make him a "good 'ol boy."

Flag Officer

Alumni who have achieved flag officer rank in any of the national uniformed military services. The Department of Defense Dictionary of Military and Associated Terms defines a Flag Officer as "A term applied to an officer holding the rank of general, lieutenant general, major general, or brigadier general in the U. S. Army, Air Force, or Marine Corps, or admiral, vice admiral, rear admiral, or commodore in the U. S. Navy or Coast Guard." The term does not include officers in state militias, defense forces or similar paramilitary forces. Achievement of flag officer rank is in itself tantamount to "eminence in a chosen field of endeavor." Selection for induction into the Hall of Fame should be withheld until the retirement or death of the subject to prevent induction before their advancement in rank is complete.

Valor

Alumni Who have been presented either the Medal of Honor or the Distinguished Service Cross, The Navy Cross of the Air Force Cross are eligible to be inducted. Civilians may also qualify by distinguishing themselves conspicuously by gallantry above and beyond the call of duty while engaged in combat against an enemy of the United States.

Citations and photos of alumni in the Hall of Fame can be viewed in the McBride Museum in Luna Hall or visit the <u>Kiosk</u>.

CELEBRATE 125 YEARS OF EXCELLENCE

As the spring semester begins, we want to update you all on the progress of the 125 Program. Over the course of the first semester your support has raised \$50,000 toward this program. If you have not already done so, we encourage you to participate by making a gift of \$125 to the 125 Program. Your support will help create scholarships for cadets who have the same drive and desire that you did when you were a member of the Corps. Remember, 2/3 of the funds raised will go directly toward the NMMI Annual Fund which supports all eligible cadets with unrestricted scholarships. The remaining 1/3 of what is raised will create a Squad Leader Endowment.

The Squad Leader Endowment will provide scholarship funds to cadets who have such a great impact and influence on the Corps of Cadets; a position that sometimes is overlooked but never forgotten. The criteria to receive this scholarship will be set by the Commandant's Staff with the hopes of providing three (3) \$1,000 scholarships to the best squad leaders in the Corps. The balance of the funds generated will provide automatic funding to the NMMI Annual Fund which supports the financial needs of prospective and current cadets without restrictions (eligible cadets must meet the minimum criteria set by the Scholarship Committee).

We look forward to your participation in this program as the year progresses. Currently, we have received roughly 400 donations toward the 125 Program; and we will continue to push to achieve our goal of 5,000 donations before 30 June 2017. As a determined and passionate group, you have already made an impact and we know you will continue to strive to keep NMMI's rich history, tradition and pursuit of excellence moving forward with your participation in the 125 Program. Ways to Give

• **Bequest** — a provision in a will or estate plan that allocates all or part of the individual's estate to NMMI.

• **Charitable Remainder Trust** — an irrevocable trust that pays a specified annual amount to one or more people for a fixed period of years (often the life of the individual). At the end of the term of the trust, the remaining trust assets are distributed to NMMI. A charitable remainder annuity trust provides a fixed payment; a charitable remainder uni-trust pays out a fixed percentage of the trust value each year.

• **Charitable Lead Trust** — Similar to a charitable remainder trust, but the principal reverts to the donor or his or her designated heirs at the end of the trust term. If the principal reverts to the donor, he or she gets a charitable income tax deduction; if an heir, that person gets a charitable gift tax deduction.

• **Charitable Gift Annuity** — an irrevocable transfer of property (e.g. securities) in exchange for a contract to pay the donor an annuity for life. Because the value of the property exceeds the value of the annuity, it is partially a gift to the institution.

• **Life Insurance** — an arrangement in which a donor gives a life insurance policy to NMMI. The cash value of that gift is tax deductible, as are any future premiums the donor may opt to pay on that policy. Note that only life insurance policies that are paid in full qualify as planned gifts. (needs a not regarding proper way of doing this.)

• Life Estate — an arrangement in which a donor gives his/her home to NMMI while retaining the right to live there for the remainder of his/her life. The donor receives an immediate income tax deduction. NMMI may sell the property upon the donor's death.

• **Pooled Income Fund** — an arrangement, similar to a mutual fund, in which a donor contributes to a fund and receives a share of the proceeds based on the percentage of his contribution. Donors pay no capital gains on the transfer of appreciated property. When the donor dies, his shares transfer to NMMI.

• **Endowments** – A fund created by your bequest can carry your name or the name of a family member or other person you wish to honor. Named funds, because of the support they offer to programs and people, are a way to share what is meaningful to you within the institute family well into the future. *Note that minimum gift amounts required for creating named, endowed funds vary, so please contact the NMMI Foundation for further information.*

• **Unrestricted Gifts** - are among the most valuable to NMMI, because they allow the institute to allocate funds wherever the need is greatest, and to take advantage of unique opportunities as they arise. Your unrestricted contribution may be used to support costs associated with financial aid, educator development, cadet equipment, facilities, and much more.

• **Matching Gifts** - An easy way to double or even triple your donation to NMMI is to find out if your company has a matching-gift program. Such programs typically match all or a percentage of employee contributions to charitable organizations, making the employer a partner in employees' personal philanthropy. Simply obtain a matching-gift form from your employer's personnel office, fill it out, and provide it to NMMI with your contribution.
