Homecoming 2016

We had a fantastic turnout for this year's Homecoming 2016.

All venues/events exceeded our expectations with record numbers. We are still compiling numbers from the weekend, but our estimated attendance was over 750. (Note: 450 in Alumni only and 300 Spouses and guests)

Our Main Events were:

-Lefty Stecklein Memorial Golf Tournament which had 52 players this year. (Note: Last year we only had 24)

-Silver Taps was a very well attended evening event. It has become one of our most attended ceremonies. Words cannot express the emotional feeling one gets when you watch the procession, especially the Comparison Horse with the rider less saddle and the boots hanging in reverse. The bagpiper playing "Amazing Grace" while our deceased alumni names are being read with a candle for each and concluding with our three buglers playing "Taps". It still brings "Goosebumps" every time I talk about it! The additional lighting on the group proved to be a great enhancement. Highlighting the Superintendent, following by the Caparisoned Horse, the Colors, followed by 17 cadets wearing our school uniforms for the past 125 years. 186 names were read. -The Alumni Social hosted in Quarters 1 also bought in a record number.

-Our Alumni Luncheon

and Hall of Fame Induction Ceremony had over 300 people in attendance. Dr. Guy Brown 1967 HS was inducted posthumously for Eminence in Field of Endeavor. Jim Solomon was honored and presented the George Ward Memorial.

Our Alumni "Love Feast" 1950's Sock Hop theme had over 240 people in attendance, with the Cross Sabers Society Breakfast having 80 people in attendance.

The Alumni Honored Class March was represented by Alumni for all years ending in "6". (Note: 1946, 1956, 1966, 1976, 1986, 1996, 2006 and many others from those decades). Dr. Gowan was our oldest attendee, from the Class of 1946.



The Alumni Honored Class Dinner had 250, which included, the Class of 1966. Our 1976 honored class met at another location with close to 80 attending their dinner, raising over \$16,000 to start a new endowment honoring Ed and Alma Croix Scholarship Endowment. Approximate total of class dinner attendees was 330.



CELEBRATE 125 YEARS OF EXCELLENCE

In collaboration and celebration of 125th anniversary at NMMI we are poised to make an impact that will help create an endowment for future cadets and bolster the Annual Fund for the upcoming year that provides instant and unrestricted financial support to current and prospective cadets. This project will kick-off and run simultaneously with fiscal year, July 1, 2016 – June 30, 2017. Donations must be made in **\$125** increments and can count towards cross saber society as well as other annual programs. Each donor who meets the above criteria will receive a tax-deduction (if applicable) and also a signature 125th anniversary coin, which will start being mailed to those who participate following Homecoming 2016.

With your continued support and determination we hope to receive 5,000 gifts of **\$125** over the course of the year. Each day a custom progress tracker will update and show how close we are to achieving the goal. One-third of the proceeds will help endow a Squad Leader scholarship that will provide funds to cadets who have such a great impact and influence on corps. A position that sometimes is looked over but never forgotten, the criteria to receive this scholarship will be set by the Commandants staff with the hopes of providing three (3) \$1,000 scholarships to the best squad leaders in the corps. The other funds generated will provide automatic funding to the annual fund that supports financial needs of prospective and current cadets without restrictions.

We look forward to your participation in this program as we move forward. As a determined and passionate group we have made such an impact and we will continue to do so as we move forward with our rich history, tradition and pursuit of excellence. General Grizzle spoke about the percentages of male and female cadets with about 19.2% women. The Corps of Cadets is almost 50-50 percentages of high school and junior college cadets.

He talked about a new "Early Warning Program" for staff and faculty to try and foresee cadet struggles early on and try to help them through it. It is felt that it is making a difference in early departures.

The General's Cup Scholarship, the Albuquerque Chapter raised about \$11,000 at the annual Phill Ingram BBQ. General Grizzle explained how the General's Cup Scholarship is less stringent on how the funds are given, providing flexibility for awarding them.

Danny Armijo talked on upcoming events, the General's Cup on 23, 24, and 25 September and Homecoming on 20-22 October. Also planned is the Denver Chapter Meet and Greet on 30 September followed immediately by the Dallas gathering to honor Roger Staubach 1962 JC at the NCJAA Hall of Fame induction and watch the NMMI Broncos play in Athens, TX, about 70 SE of Dallas. Everyone who can make it is encouraged to attend and support our Broncos! We will be sending more information in the next few days. Kansas City Meet and Greet will be on 12 November, so mark your calendars. Watch for your invitation coming out soon. Florida in early December is still in the works.

Save the date 2017 Generals Cup 22-24 September

It was another banner year for the NMMI General's Cup. Each year the goal is to net at least \$50,000, over the course of the last 5 years this goal has been achieved. Thanks to the hard work of the staff and committee involved we have seen the support and involvement grow each year and this past event in September was no different.

We had 68 teams and 204 golfers participate along with over 100 sponsors and donors. We were again able to achieve and exceed our goal and early indications lead us to believe that we will be close to \$60,000 net. The initial \$50,000 raised is placed in an endowment that is managed by the NMMI Foundation, over the course of the last 5 years that endowment will be close to \$270,000 to include this year and earnings. The remaining monies are distributed to financial aid to be used as incentive scholarships.

NMMI and I personally cannot thank all of you who participate enough and support this event that makes such a huge impact on current and future cadets. The General's Cup has grown into one of, if not the premier tournaments/scholarship gala events in the southeastern region of New Mexico. Athletic programs at NMMI wrapping up a successful fall season

The fall sports season is drawing to a close; here's some of the highlights of this year's teams:



• Lady Colt Sierra Walker finished fourth at the state cross country meet in Rio Rancho after earning six straight first-place medals during the season, including the district title.

• The Bronco cross country team earned three first-place individual titles at meets this season, along with two third-place finishes. They also and took home second as a team at the NMJC Invitational meet. Head coach Jan

Olesinski and his top-four runners will head next to the NJCAA National Championships in El Dorado, Kans.,

Nov. 12, hoping for more individual top-10 finishes at the national tournament.



NJCAA National Championships in Cheyenne, Wyo., Nov. 17-19, their third trip to nationals in four years. At the Regional tourney, third-seeded NMMI downed six-seeded Clarendon College in the first round, knocked off No. 2 Midland in the semi-finals, then defeated the fourth seed Western Texas College (who had upended top-seeded Odessa College in the other semi-final match) in the championships.



• Head coach Randy Montoya and his Colt football team earned a berth in the state playoffs. They were selected as the No. 12 seed in Class 4A and are set to play at Hatch Valley in the first round on Nov. 11.

• The Bronco volleyball team won the Region V West post-season tournament, earning a bid to the
