CW4 J. C. DODD, USAR (RET) 1978 HS

J.C. Dodd was born in Midland, TX. From as early as he can remember he wanted to be a military helicopter pilot. When J.C. learned of New Mexico Military Institute, he knew that was where he had to go to prepare for his future.

His RAT year roommate Robert G. "Bob" French 1978 HS, one of J.C.'s lifelong friends likes to say, after living with J.C., he could live with anybody.

J.C. was a member of the Goss Rifle Team and his senior year the commander and executive officer. His mentors on the team included Michael B. "Mike" Bernard 1978 JC (drill team commander '75 - '76) David E. Bodie 1979 JC (drill team commander in '76 -'77) and MAJ William C. "Bill" Hoh, USA (Ret) 1976 JC (college drill team member, advisor to the high school team in '75 -'76 and also J.C.'s platoon leader).

Following graduation from NMMI, J.C. enlisted in the U.S. Marine Corps Reserves. After learning about the U.S. Army Warrant Officer Flight program, J.C. applied and in May of 1983 transferred to the U.S. Army for flight school at Fort Rucker, AL. During his eight years on active duty with the U.S. Army, his first assignment was Fort Kobbe/Howard Air Force Base in the Republic of Panama and his second was at Fort Carson, CO. During these assignments, J.C. flew missions in Hueys throughout Central and South America, the western U.S. and also in Alaska. In 1986, J.C. flew assault and destroy missions against cocaine laboratories in Bolivia.

J.C. retired in March 2000 as a Chief Warrant Officer 4 and a Master Army Aviator.

While at Fort Carson, J.C. attended several training rotations at Fort Irwin, CA, and met some of the California Highway Patrol (CHP) helicopter pilots stationed at the Barstow-Daggett Airport. As a result, he applied to become a CHP officer and started at the CHP Academy in September 0 1990.

After graduation from the CHP Academy in January 1991, J.C. was assigned to the Marin CHP Office (just north of San Francisco) as a road patrol officer. In November 1993, J.C. transferred to the Valley Division Air Operations unit in Auburn where he flew search and rescue, medevac, law enforcement, traffic management and homeland security missions until he retired in May 2010.

J.C. has also received a Police Officer Commendation from the State Attorney General, five CHP Commissioner's Certificates of Achievement, a Division Chief's Commendation, a Commander's Commendation, 2 Sikorsky Helicopters Lifesaving Rescue Awards and two Bronze Medals of Honor and a Distinguished Service Award from Placer County. Upon his retirement from the CHP, he received a State Senate Resolution of Commendation from Senator Sam Aanestad.

In May 2010, J.C. retired from the CHP after twenty years of service. J.C. has been flying helicopters for over twenty-nine years and has logged over 8,300 accident-free flight hours. During his careers with the Army and the CHP, J.C. medevac'd 586 patients and rescued 325 victims. Shortly after J.C. retired from the

CHP, the Placer County Sheriff requested that J.C. join his Air Support Unit.


