N.M.M.I. ALUMNI BATAAN DEATH MARCH TEAM

There are over 60 New Mexico Military Institute alums, friends, and family that have registered so far to represent N.M.M.I. and honor those of Bataan on 15 March 2020. In addition to those members from New Mexico, there are others from Kentucky, Kansas, Missouri, Arizona, California, Colorado, and Washington D.C.

The Bataan Memorial Death March is a high desert, pure perseverance challenge at White Sands Missile Range in South Central New Mexico. It is dedicated to honor the heroic World War II service members who served in the Philippine Islands. Over 75,000 U.S. soldiers were from the Army, Army Air Corps, Navy, and Marines, to include members of the 200th Coast Artillery from the New Mexico National Guard.

The activities for the team start months before the event with preparation and conditioning to be ready for either a 14.2 or a 26.2-mile march. Individuals participating can walk it, run it, or ruck it with a 35-pound pack (or any weight...some folks choose more, some less) or with no pack at all! There is also the option of forming a five-person team that must start and finish together for the 26.2-mile march. In 2019, almost 9,000 individuals from the United States and other countries marched in honor of those of Bataan. This year they are expecting nearly 10,000 participants!

The weekend begins with a variety of activities with a country music concert on Friday night, 13 March, at the Pan American center in Las Cruces. The performers are Gary Allen and Lee Brice and tickets are available now through Ticketmaster. In addition to the kickoff concert Friday night, there will be many activities both at the convention center and on White Sands Missile Range. There will be seminars on Friday and Saturday on how to ruck and properly pack, historical seminars on the Bataan Death March, an opportunity to hear the stories from the survivors themselves (a highlight each year!), gold medal presentation to Philippine veterans who fought along side Americans presented by the Philippine Delegation, a rock concert Friday night on White Sands Missile Range for those who do not go to the country concert. Check out the Bataan website and schedule that will be part of the packet pick up for more details and times.

The NMMI Team will also have a Saturday morning breakfast, luncheon, and dinner. The dinner is the pre-march highlight with a variety of fun and memorable activities. Information on the times and locations will be sent to the team directly and will be posted at <u>www.steveduran.wixsite.com/bataan</u>.

The installation also opens its gates to RV/trailer/tent campers. These campsites are convenient to access the start/finish line and are free! If you are not able to march but want to be part of the excitement and patriotic atmosphere, volunteers are always needed and both on the installation and at the convention center. Volunteers can sign up through <u>www.bataanmarch.com</u>. The NMMI Alumni Team is also encouraging folks to be part of its support team!

Colonel Chris Ward, NMMI class of 94JC is the Garrison Commander at White Sands Missile Range and Steve Duran, your host from the class of 83HS, 87JC, along with the NMMI Alumni Office extend an invitation for you to be a part of this challenging event. Adalinda Rivera 91KC from the El Paso chapter, Denise Kawas, Gregory Peebles 77JC, and Jordy Wommack 80HS from the Albuquerque chapter have been instrumental in supporting and promoting the event. Ways to Give

• **Bequest** — a provision in a will or estate plan that allocates all or part of the individual's estate to NMMI.

• **Charitable Remainder Trust** — an irrevocable trust that pays a specified annual amount to one or more people for a fixed period of years (often the life of the individual). At the end of the term of the trust, the remaining trust assets are distributed to NMMI. A charitable remainder annuity trust provides a fixed payment; a charitable remainder uni-trust pays out a fixed percentage of the trust value each year.

• **Charitable Lead Trust** — Similar to a charitable remainder trust, but the principal reverts to the donor or his or her designated heirs at the end of the trust term. If the principal reverts to the donor, he or she gets a charitable income tax deduction; if an heir, that person gets a charitable gift tax deduction.

• **Charitable Gift Annuity** — an irrevocable transfer of property (e.g. securities) in exchange for a contract to pay the donor an annuity for life. Because the value of the property exceeds the value of the annuity, it is partially a gift to the institution.

• Life Insurance — an arrangement in which a donor gives a life insurance policy to NMMI. The cash value of that gift is tax deductible, as are any future premiums the donor may opt to pay on that policy. Note that only life insurance policies that are paid in full qualify as planned gifts. (needs a not regarding proper way of doing this.)

• Life Estate — an arrangement in which a donor gives his/her home to NMMI while retaining the right to live there for the remainder of his/her life. The donor receives an immediate income tax deduction. NMMI may sell the property upon the donor's death.

• **Pooled Income Fund** — an arrangement, similar to a mutual fund, in which a donor contributes to a fund and receives a share of the proceeds based on the percentage of his contribution. Donors pay no capital gains on the transfer of appreciated property. When the donor dies, his shares transfer to NMMI.

• **Endowments** – A fund created by your bequest can carry your name or the name of a family member or other person you wish to honor. Named funds, because of the support they offer to programs and people, are a way to share what is meaningful to you within the institute family well into the future. *Note that minimum gift amounts required for creating named, endowed funds vary, so please contact the NMMI Foundation for further information.*

• **Unrestricted Gifts** - are among the most valuable to NMMI, because they allow the institute to allocate funds wherever the need is greatest, and to take advantage of unique opportunities as they arise. Your unrestricted contribution may be used to support costs associated with financial aid, educator development, cadet equipment, facilities, and much more.

• Matching Gifts - An easy way to double or even triple your donation to NMMI is to find out if your company has a matching-gift program. Such programs typically match all or a percentage of employee contributions to charitable organizations, making the employer a partner in employees' personal philanthropy. Simply obtain a matching-gift form from your employer's personnel office, fill it out, and provide it to NMMI with your contribution.
