NMMI Accreditation

On September 14, the NMMI Junior College will undergo a comprehensive evaluation for reaffirming its accreditation as a junior college with the higher learning commission. Many on the campus over the past two years have been engaged in the preparation, but our success will require that our constituents be involved. For your information, below is information about accreditation:

<u>What is accreditation?</u> What an audit is to a business organization, and inspection of a military facility, an accreditation is a formal evaluation of all aspects of an academic institution and its educational programs. It is a validation of its vision, mission and its success in realizing them by a completely independent, outside, objective agency.

Why is it important? If a college or university is not accredited, its students are not eligible for any form of federal aid, the courses that they take are not transferable to other colleges or institutions, and the degrees they earn have little value because they are not recognized or even accepted by external institutions or agencies. Academic institutions that remain unaccredited usually must close.

How can you be involved? In order for you to participate with the accreditation team, you are invited to be a member of their Zoom meeting. There are three open forums on September 14th in which you can participate (these are all in Mountain time):

Commandant of Cadets/Dean of Students

New Mexico Military Institute invites applications for the position of Commandant of Cadets.

NMMI is a state-supported, college preparatory high school and junior college, complete with Junior and Senior ROTC programs. With a Corps of Cadets numbering more than 900 young men and women, NMMI provides an accredited college preparatory curriculum on the high school level. All cadets live on campus while school is in session. The junior college prepares graduating cadets for transfer to senior colleges. Since 1909, NMMI has been recognized as a Distinguished Military School. NMMI is located in Roswell in southeastern New Mexico, a city with population of approximately 50,000.

New Mexico Military Institute's educational philosophy stresses the development of its cadets in the NMMI mission areas: academics (mind), and physical (body), and leadership (soul) development. NMMI, through its honor code, emphasizes duty and honor. Life as a member of the Corps of Cadets contributes both to a sense of worth and to scholarly achievement.

Candidates for the Commandant of Cadets must have an outstanding record of leadership and achievement. A Master's degree is required, and an academic background or experience in education is preferred. Applicant must be in excellent physical condition. Prior military service with successful command experience at Battalion or higher level or its equivalent is required. Candidate must have prior service in the U.S. Armed Forces (Active, National Guard or Reserves) at the rank of Lieutenant Colonel or maritime forces (U.S. Navy and U.S. Coast Guard) at the rank of Commander or higher. The ideal candidate would be a graduate of NMMI, or a graduate of another military academy or school, or have prior experience as an Administrator at a military school or academy.

Compensation is competitive and dependent on experience and qualifications. On Post Housing is provided and the required official residence of the Commandant of Cadets, "Quarters 2".

A letter of interest, a completed NMMI application, available at https://www.nmmi.edu/human-resources/employment-opportunities/, together with a résumé describing the candidate's qualifications and the names, addresses and telephone numbers of five references must be forwarded to New Mexico Military Institute Commandant of Cadets' Search Committee, 101 West College Blvd, Roswell, NM 88201. Applications/nominations will be accepted until finalists have been selected for the position. The successful applicant will begin work on or about August 1, 2020. Ways to Give

- **Bequest** a provision in a will or estate plan that allocates all or part of the individual's estate to NMMI.
- Charitable Remainder Trust an irrevocable trust that pays a specified annual amount to one or more people for a fixed period of years (often the life of the individual). At the end of the term of the trust, the remaining trust assets are distributed to NMMI. A charitable remainder annuity trust provides a fixed payment; a charitable remainder uni-trust pays out a fixed percentage of the trust value each year.
- Charitable Lead Trust Similar to a charitable remainder trust, but the principal reverts to the donor or his or her designated heirs at the end of the trust term. If the principal reverts to the donor, he or she gets a charitable income tax deduction; if an heir, that person gets a charitable gift tax deduction.
- Charitable Gift Annuity an irrevocable transfer of property (e.g. securities) in exchange for a contract to pay the donor an annuity for life. Because the value of the property exceeds the value of the annuity, it is partially a gift to the institution.
- Life Insurance an arrangement in which a donor gives a life insurance policy to NMMI. The cash value of that gift is tax deductible, as are any future premiums the donor may opt to pay on that policy. Note that only life insurance policies that are paid in full qualify as planned gifts. (needs a not regarding proper way of doing this.)
- Life Estate an arrangement in which a donor gives his/her home to NMMI while retaining the right to live there for the remainder of his/her life. The donor receives an immediate income tax deduction. NMMI may sell the property upon the donor's death.
- **Pooled Income Fund** an arrangement, similar to a mutual fund, in which a donor contributes to a fund and receives a share of the proceeds based on the percentage of his contribution. Donors pay no capital gains on the transfer of appreciated property. When the donor dies, his shares transfer to NMMI.
- **Endowments** A fund created by your bequest can carry your name or the name of a family member or other person you wish to honor. Named funds, because of the support they offer to programs and people, are a way to share what is meaningful to you within the institute family well into the future. *Note that minimum gift amounts required for creating named, endowed funds vary, so please contact the NMMI Foundation for further information.*
- Unrestricted Gifts are among the most valuable to NMMI, because they allow the institute to allocate funds wherever the need is greatest, and to take advantage of unique opportunities as they arise. Your unrestricted contribution may be used to support costs associated with financial aid, educator development, cadet equipment, facilities, and much more.
- Matching Gifts An easy way to double or even triple your donation to NMMI is to find out if your company has a matching-gift program. Such programs typically match all or a percentage of employee contributions to charitable organizations, making the employer a partner in employees' personal philanthropy. Simply obtain a matching-gift form from your employer's personnel office, fill it out, and provide it to NMMI with your contribution.
