New Mexico Military Institute (NMMI) is a Service Academy Preparatory School for all five service academies; The United States Air Force Academy, the United States Merchant Marine Academy, the United States Naval Academy, the United States Military Academy (West Point), and the United States Coast Guard Academy. NMMI provides an excellent academic schedule that mimics the academy's first—year academic schedule and a world-class physical fitness program to help all preparatory students pass the perspective physical fitness test. The Prep program consists of community service projects such as feeding people experiencing

homelessness, spending time with the senior citizens at their community homes, and the local elementary school mentorship program. We conduct military training such as high rope, low rope, rappel tower, swimming survival, and high altitude training to mention a few. We currently have a 100 percent success rate for sponsored preps

and two self-preps who have received their appointments to one of the United States Military Service Academy.

Not only is the program extremely challenging, but it is also nationally recognized for its success. We have first-rate facilities designed to prepare cadets not only academically, but to help prepare them to meet the physical challenges they will face at the academies and to give them a leg up on the leadership skills they will need to excel.

Our Mission is to educate, train, and prepare young men and women to be leaders capable of critical thinking and sound analysis, leaders who possess uncompromising character, and leaders able to meet challenging physical demands.

Lady Bronco Cross Country

Bronco cross-country runner and pentathlete Charlotte Ahaus recently signed on to fence at the University of the Incarnate Word in San Antonio, TX, where she will join older sister Viktoria and train under the tutelage of renowned coach John Moreau.

Back in October, at the Union Internationale de Pentathlon Moderne 2022 Pentathlon Junior World Championships in Poland, the Ahaus sisters finished first for Team USA in the fencing portion of the competition and had strong performances in the other disciplines to finish fifth in the women's relay.

UIW came calling for Viktoria soon after, but it was a harder decision for Charlotte, who is a freshman and was hesitant to leave her first American home behind.

"NMMI has helped me become a better person and athlete and it was a struggle deciding to leave early," she said. "I loved my coaches here and they really became like family, so I know we will always stay in touch."

Ahaus trained under NMMI's longtime do-all coach and 1980 Olympic bronze winner Jan Olesinski, and Olesinski's protégé, Bronco cross-country coach and 2016 Olympian Nathan Schrimsher

Schrimsher said Ahaus was a joy to coach and while he's a little sad he won't have her on his cross-country team for another year, he's excited to see what she will accomplish at an NCAA Division I program

"She's just a great athlete and a great person. She came here from Germany to a new culture and really worked hard to do well in the classroom and in her sport," Schrimsher said. "Of course I wouldn't want to hold her back from pursuing her dreams, but she will be missed around here. But I'm sure we'll see each other around. The pentathlon world is small." Ahaus plans to study business and hopes to stay at UIW until she earns a Master of Business Administation. She is also excited about rejoining big sister Viktoria, who graduated from NMMI in December.

"I love being teammates with my sister," she said. "We know how to push each other and when I train with her, I always feel like I'm getting better."


Ahaus said she will miss her cross-country team, which consisted of herself and Viktoria and two Roswell natives, who

helped make her transition to the United States easier and enjoyable.

"I learned a lot from them, especially about the local culture," Ahaus explained. "They always explained things to me and never judged me. We became friends and spent time together outside of practice and competition. They made me feel more at home."



Colt Baseball – Win Against Tucumcari

The Colt baseball team won their final regular-season home game against Tucumcari on Tuesday, 15-1, to move to 20-3 overall and 11-2 in district.

They've got two more district games left, both at Ruidoso on Saturday, prior to the start of the 2023 NMAA Class 3A State Championships, which begins next week.

NMMI made short work of the Rattlers, plating II runs in the first two innings. Senior Miguel Rivera got the start on the mound for the Colts giving up no runs, earned or otherwise, for two innings. Fellow seniors Bailey Mego and Gentry Caplan combined to close out the last three stanzas.

Despite the 15-run tally, the Colts managed just eight hits, led by Caplan's 2-for-4 performance at the plate.

"Right now we're tied [with Sandia Prep] for district," said NMMI head coach Brad Blackwell. "But they've got the head-to-head against us in the three-game series. We need to definitely take two on Saturday vs. Ruidoso. Then, hopefully, we'll be seeded as one of the top three teams in the state – and those seedings come out Sunday."

If the Colts are selected as one of the top-four teams in Class AAA, they'll receive a first-round bye and head up to Albuquerque for the quarterfinals on May 11.

If lower than the fourth-seed, which seems unlikely due to sitting atop the AAA standings, they would play a first-round best-of-three series on May 5th & 6th at the higher-seed's home park.

The four Colt seniors on the New Mexico Military Institute high school baseball team were honored prior to the Tucumcari game.

Senior Bailey Mego has played just about every position of the field this season for the Colts with an .810 fielding percentage. He's also been solid at the plate with a .367 batting average and a .519 on-base percentage.

Senior Gentry Caplan has developed into NMMI's starter at second base with just one error in 41 total chances this season, along with a .385 batting average and .590 slugging percentage.

Senior Sergio Gonzales has split time at both in the outfield and at first base this season. Gonzales typically hits in the ninth-spot on the lineup card, but is another above .300 hitter for the Colts (.368 to be exact) and has scored an impressive 29 runs.

Miguel Rivera boasts a 6-0 record on the mound for the Colts, along with two saves. When he's not pitching, the 6'I" senior is a big target at first base. Rivera's offense is among the team's best: .409 avg, 34 RBIs, 36 runs scored, five HRs and an outstanding .879 slugging percentage.

"I'm glad that we got to recognize our seniors," finished coach Blackwell. "Those guys put a lot of time and effort in, both on the field and off. There're just a good group of hardworking players – we'll definitely miss those guys in the future."
