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Academics- Fall Review

NMMI has had a banner year. Niche, Academic Influence, and Boarding School Review ranked NMMI as the #1 community college in the state. Our ranking puts us in the top 2% of community colleges in the nation, ranking 16 out of 906. In addition, Boarding School Review ranked NMMI in the top five military schools in the nation and the #2 Most Influential institution in New Mexico behind UNM. Niche ranked the high school #1 in Chaves County. So, how did NMMI get such honors and distinctions?

NMMI ACT scores average 23% and 28% above the national and state averages, respectively. We have the highest qualified faculty in the state for high schools and community colleges at 98.3% with advanced degrees compared to the NM state average of 47%. GPAs have increased by 5% from the previous years, faculty evaluations improved to 4.51 out of 5.0, assessment scores of our key outcomes increased, demerits and absenteeism decreased, and our early warning system repeatedly catches struggling students. Our teachers score 20% higher than the New Mexico average.

The best part of NMMI is what we do for our at-risk students. NMMI has the highest transfer-out rate for Title IV students (financial aid/at-risk kids) in the United States at 71%. NM is 19%, and the national average is 25%. The next best score was 62%. Additionally, NMMI's chronic absenteeism is half a percent, while the New Mexico average is 40%. Our JROTC has won the Honor Unit with Distinction Award (HUD) for the 7th year in a row—the highest honor given to a JROTC unit. Our academy prep program grew by 250%. Students graduating from NMMI are assessed each year on critical thinking, oral communication, written communication, information literacy, applying technology, leading and working with others, selfdevelopment, and leading with presence. Every year a cadet stays at NMMI, their scores increase in every area. The cadets walking at graduation are some of the most well-prepared students for college or work.

Thanks to the faculty's excellent teaching and the support staff's outstanding work, our cadets get a world-class education at NMMI.



Veteran senior swimmer Mary Kathryn Olvera took first place in the women's 50-yard freestyle swim at Saturday's Artesia Invitational, posting a time of 26.67 seconds, edging Alamogordo's Sonja Davis by three-hundredths of a second.

Her time was .32 seconds slower than her personal best set at November's Wildcat Invite in Lovington. Olvera took third at that meet. Olvera also finished sixth in the 500-yard freestyle with a time of 6:04.63, this time hitting the wall just behind Davis and almost 20 seconds behind the winner, Colette Dhenin of Carlsbad.

Newcomer Danilo Brito, a sophomore from Brazil, snagged two first-place medals, dominating the competition in both events. In the men's 200-yard freestyle, Brito defeated Edgar Dias of Hobbs by almost five seconds with a time of 1:56.69. His 50-yard splits were 25.31, 28.85, 31.57 and 30.96.

Colt basketball took home the consolation championship trophy, corralling Cobre 47-41.



NMMI Intermediate Preparatory Academy <u>Grand Opening!</u>

The Intermediate Preparatory Academy (IPA) had an exceptional inaugural year, a result of the NMMI's initiative to provide local students with a high-quality intermediate learning option. With strong support from NMMI senior officials, including President/Superintendent MG Jerry Grizzle, Chief of Staff COL David West, and CFO COL Deana Curnutt, along with collaborative efforts from various departments, IPA transitioned from concept to reality within 18 months. The school, located at 402 W. Country Club, welcomed its first class of 6th-grade students in August 2023.

The Alumni and Learning Center Staff played a crucial role by temporarily accommodating IPA in the Daniels Leadership Center until the school building's first phase of construction was completed. Led by Director Kris Ward and COL Tom Tate, the IPA received unwavering support to ensure a seamless learning experience. On October 16, 2023, IPA students moved into their own school building, hosting a student-led Grand Opening ceremony within a week.

Whether at the Daniels Leadership Center or the IPA school, students thrived in a challenging learning environment, exhibiting notable academic, leadership, and behavioral improvements. In reading, 45% of students showed a full year's growth in just half a year, while in math, 59% demonstrated the same progress. Notably, IPA prioritizes experiential learning beyond the classroom, with students engaging in various offcampus activities, including collaborating with a local artist, visiting the library, conducting field-based research in local parks, and immersing themselves in a two-week theme, "Love Where You Live," exploring community landmarks and interviewing influential citizens.


