NMMI ATHLETIC DIRECTOR JOSE BARRON PRAISED SOUKUP'S QUALIFICATIONS AND FAMILIARITY WITH THE PROGRAM. SOUKUP EXPRESSED GRATITUDE AND EXCITEMENT, EMPHASIZING HARD WORK, SELF-DISCIPLINE, AND BELIEF AS HIS COACHING CORNERSTONES. HE IS THE SIXTH HEAD COACH OF THE BRONCOS SINCE 2000, WITH ALL PREVIOUS COACHES ACHIEVING POSTSEASON SUCCESS.

IN ADDITION, THE COMMITMENT TO SERVICE AND DUTY TO GIVE BACK TO THOSE WHO GAVE ME THE TOOLS AND RESOURCES LED ME TO THE AMERICAN INDIAN SCIENCE AND ENGINEERING SOCIETY (AISES) WHERE I AM A LIFETIME MEMBER AND CURRENTLY SERVING ON THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS. DEAR NMMI ALUMNI,

IT IS WITH DEEP SORROW THAT WE INFORM YOU OF THE PASSING OF FORMER SUPERINTENDENT AND PRESIDENT, COLONEL BOB KEMBLE. COLONEL KEMBLE, WHO LED NMMI DURING A CRITICAL PERIOD FROM 1971 TO 1977, PASSED AWAY ON MONDAY EVENING, JULY 22, 2024, AT THE AGE OF 98. COLONEL KEMBLE WAS APPOINTED SUPERINTENDENT DURING A CHALLENGING ERA MARKED BY SOCIETAL UNREST AND INSTITUTIONAL CHALLENGES. UNDER HIS LEADERSHIP, HE NAVIGATED NMMI THROUGH DIFFICULT TIMES, SIGNIFICANTLY IMPACTING ITS COURSE AND ENSURING ITS CONTINUED MISSION.
