Attendees will also have access to enclosed showers and sink rooms, a fishing pond, and 250 acres featuring much more. There is plenty of offsite lodging available in Mayhill (9 miles away), Cloudcroft (19 miles away), and Ruidoso for those who prefer to travel a little further.

We will have themed dinners each night, so please watch for more information to follow, as well as our first-ever cornhole tournament on June 6 and live entertainment featuring two different bands on Thursday and Friday. If golf is something you enjoy, there is a wonderful 9-hole course in Cloudcroft and multiple options in Ruidoso, or you can drive down to Alamogordo, just 40 miles away. The casinos are always open in Ruidoso, or you can visit the telescopes in Sunspot. This location truly offers something for everyone of any age.

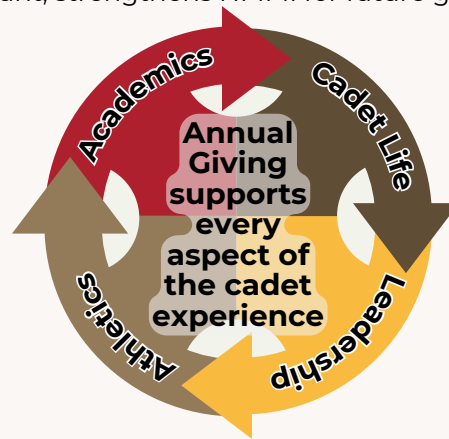

This year's symposium featured two dynamic alumni speakers, Brad Larsen '96JC and Blake Olson '92HS/'94JC, who shared their experiences and strategies for building thriving businesses.

HONORING FALLEN SOLDIERS: VIETNAM MEMORIAL PROJECT FOR THE 173RD AIRBORNE BRIGADE



COL. JIM MATCHIN 1966 HS 1968 JC

A Vietnam War veteran, is working to honor the soldiers of his generation who served with the 173rd Airborne Brigade. With support from the Brigade Commander, Col. Joshua Gaspard, Matchin is creating memorials for fallen soldiers to be placed at company headquarters in Vicenza, Italy, and Grafenwoehr, Germany. These memorials will include the names, photos, and details of the 1,790 Sky Soldiers who died during the Vietnam War, ensuring their legacy is remembered by both their families and current soldiers. The memorials aim to strengthen connections between families and the unit while serving as a constant reminder of the sacrifices made by soldiers during Vietnam. Matchin hopes to complete the project by June, in time for the 173rd Airborne Brigade Association reunion.

Colonel Allen D. Baker, 72, passed away on February 22, 2025, after a courageous battle with aggressive kidney cancer. He was a beloved husband, father, grandfather, uncle, brother, and a cherished friend. He leaves behind a legacy of dedication, service, and love that will be deeply missed by all who knew him.

Born on October 11, 1952, in Lincoln, NE, Al's family moved to Colorado when he was just six months old. He graduated from New Mexico Military Institute in May 1971 and continued his education at Colorado State University. Upon graduating in 1975, he was commissioned as a 2nd Lieutenant in the United States Air Force as an Air Force ROTC Distinguished Graduate. He retired from the Air Force on January 1, 2003, after a distinguished career, which included serving as a Missileer and in Space Operations. Known for his hard work, dedication, mentorship, and sense of humor, Al's contributions to the Air Force were immense.

In his final Air Force assignment, Allen served as Vice Commander of the 50th Space Wing, overseeing the command and control of Department of Defense satellites and other space operations, a role he held before the establishment of the United States Space Force.

Above all, Al was a devoted family man. He is survived by his loving wife of 50 years, Colonel Debby Baker, USAF Retired, his daughter Alaina, her husband Nick, and his grandson Loudon. He also cherished his brother, Colonel Rick Baker, USAF Retired (NMMI JC '70), and his sister-in-law Elsie, along with his extended family, nieces, nephews, and cousins. Al was always ready to host family gatherings, travel the world, remodel homes, attend his grandson's wrestling matches, and embrace the joys of life.

Al was preceded in death by his parents, LTC Richard Baker, US Army Retired, and Imogene (Niemeyer) Baker of Colorado Springs, CO.

In retirement, Al remained actively involved in his community and church. He served as Church Council President, Treasurer of the Trust Board, Sunday School Teacher, and was especially fond of teaching children about Jesus at Vacation Bible School. He was a past president of the Corvettes West Car Club and the non-profit Community Grief Center (CGC) Board of Directors, where his fundraising efforts left a lasting impact. Al's generosity, humor, and love of life were an inspiration to all who knew him.

He often credited his time at NMMI for providing him with the strength and discipline to navigate life's challenges and achieve his goals. The training and experiences he gained at NMMI shaped him through difficult times, including his final moments. Allen loved God, his family, his country, and his community. His life was a living example of how to live, work, laugh, forgive, and love. His memory will forever be a beacon of inspiration.

Al's legacy lives on, a testament to a life well-lived between the dash of 1952-2025.

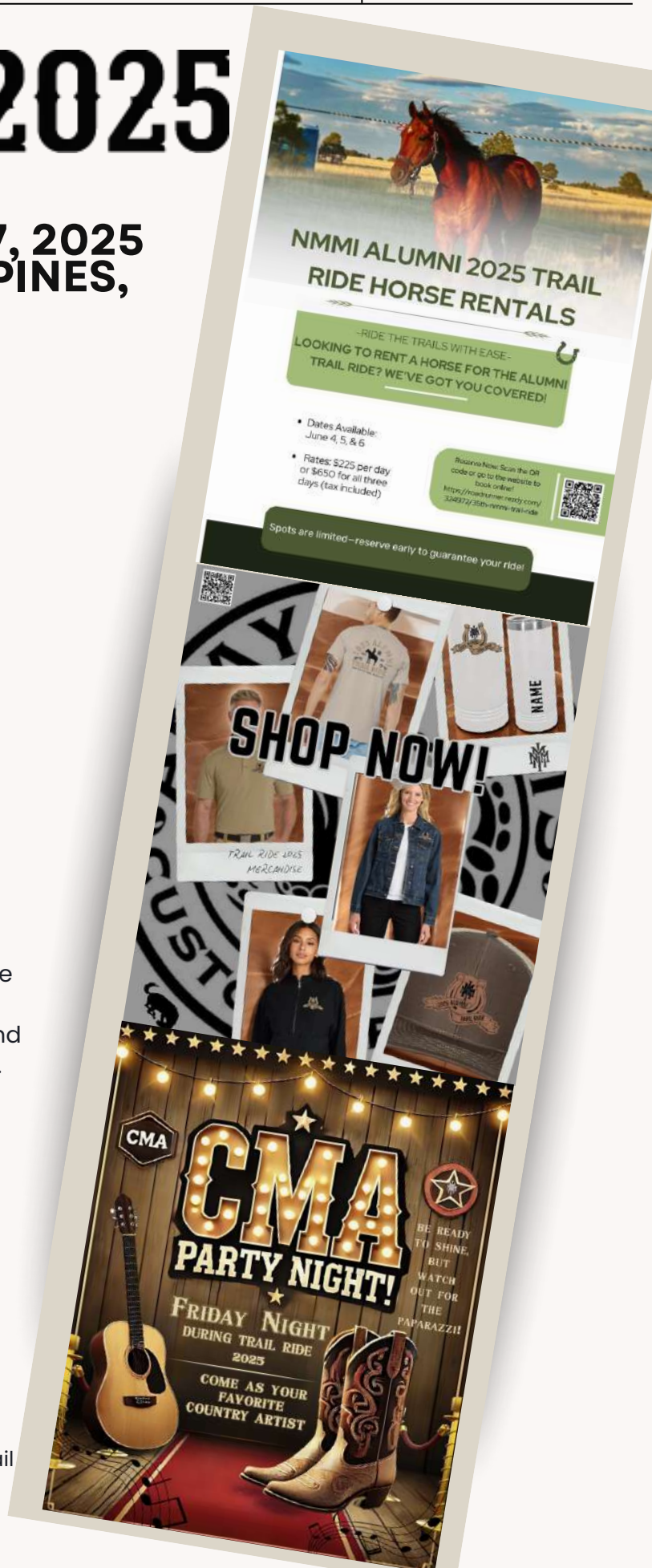

TRAIL RIDE CAMPING SAFETY TIPS

GENERAL SAFETY:

- Follow Instructions: Listen to trail guides and staff.
- Stay on Trails: Stick to marked paths.
- Maintain Distance: Keep a safe distance from riders, horses, and ATVs.
- Wear Gear: Sturdy boots, long pants, helmets (if applicable), sunscreen, and hats.
- Bring Water: Stay hydrated, especially in heat.
- First Aid Kit: Available but bring personal medications.
- Report Concerns: Inform staff of any safety issues or injuries.
- Cell Phone: Let someone know your location, bring a phone if possible.
- Night Illumination: Bring flashlights or headlamps.
- Speed Limit: 5 mph on campgrounds.
- Smoking in designated areas only and dispose of all cigarette butts and cigars in trash cans or receptacles.

HORSEBACK RIDING:

- Horse Handling: Only experienced riders should handle horses.
- Mount/Dismount: Use designated areas, get assistance if needed.
- Horse Behavior: Avoid sudden movements.
- Reins: Hold reins securely at all times.
- Speed: Follow guide instructions on gait and speed.

ATV SAFETY:

- Operator Training: Only licensed, trained drivers.
- Speed: Keep a safe speed, especially on uneven ground.
- No Reckless Driving: Avoid sharp turns or wheelies.
- Passenger Safety: Ensure helmets are worn, and passengers are seated properly.

CONTROLLED BURNS & EVACUATION:

- Controlled Burns: Be aware of nearby burns.
- Evacuation Signal: Continuous bell sound means evacuation.
- Evacuation Point: Head to the corral immediately.
- Follow Instructions: Listen to staff during evacuations.
- Stay Calm: Stay orderly in emergencies.

ENVIRONMENTAL CONSIDERATIONS:

- Leave No Trace: Pack out all trash.
- Respect Wildlife: Do not disturb wildlife.
- Fire Safety: No personal fires allowed.
