

HOW TO BECOME A MEMBER

Membership begins with a \$1,000 annual contribution, qualifying you for the NMMI Annual Fellowship level. To maintain your status and benefits in the Crossed Sabers Society, this \$1,000 minimum must be given each fiscal year. From there, your cumulative giving over time may elevate you to higher tiers of recognition, including:

- NMMI Distinguished \$50,000–\$99,999



HELPYOU.

Many NMMI alumni and friends use **Individual Retirement Accounts (IRAs)** to build long-term financial security. But did you know your IRA can also be a powerful way to support the next generation of cadets?

A quick overview of IRAs:

An IRA is a personal retirement account that offers tax advantages to help you save. The two main types are:

- <u>Traditional IRA:</u> Contributions are often tax-deductible, and withdrawals in retirement are taxed as income.
- Roth IRA: Contributions are made with after-tax dollars, but qualified withdrawals are tax-free.

People often begin contributing to IRAs in their 20s or 30s, building up savings over decades with the help of compound interest and tax benefits. At age 59½, you can begin making withdrawals without penalty. And at age 73, you must begin taking **Required Minimum Distributions (RMDs)** from traditional IRAs.

A giving option after age 70½:

If you are 70½ or older, you can make a **Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD)**, a direct gift from your IRA to a nonprofit like NMMI. This option is especially helpful if you don't need all of your RMD or if you are looking for a tax-efficient way to give.

Here's how a QCD works:

- You direct your IRA custodian to send a gift straight to NMMI
- The amount (up to \$100,000 per year) does not count as taxable income
- It can count toward your RMD for the year

For many donors, this means they can support scholarships, academic programs, and cadet leadership development, while potentially lowering their tax burden.

IRA GIVING: QUICK Q&A

What's the benefit of giving from my IRA?

If you're 70½ or older, giving directly from your IRA can reduce your taxable income (even if you don't itemize deductions).

How much can I give?

You can transfer up to \$100,000 per year through a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD).

Does it count toward my Required Minimum Distribution (RMD)?

Yes. A QCD can count toward your RMD if you are 73 or older.

Does the gift have to go straight to NMMI?

Yes. The transfer must go directly from your IRA custodian to NMMI to qualify as a QCD.

Can I make a QCD from my Roth IRA?

Technically yes, but it's less common since Roth IRAs are not subject to RMDs during your lifetime. Traditional IRAs are more typical for QCDs.

Who should I talk to?

Start with your IRA provider or financial advisor. Then let NMMI know so we can thank you properly and ensure the gift is directed as you wish.


In October, we turn our focus to one of the most beloved traditions of the year—Homecoming 2025.
